The 2012 budget statement committed the government to publish a detailed plan, setting out its response on changes to Part L of the Building Regulations by May 2013. However, the detailed requirements of the updates have still not materialised. Without the comprehensive update of Part L, many fear that the government's ambitious carbon reduction target is unrealistic.

The delay is causing a multitude of concerns and the longer it continues the more potent they become, with some designers now creating multiple building models to compensate for the uncertainty. This drives up costs for clients, diverts money away from new projects and can even cause work to be terminated. Manufacturers are also losing out too, with the possibility of having to repeat detailed U-value calculations when new regulations are published. Read
